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The Vice Presidency provides leadership and oversight of these programs, their personnel, and their roles at the institution. Additionally, the Vice President's office provides central financial administration for the division and centralized employee engagement and professional development. Examples here include divisional assessment of program effectiveness, personnel development in the conversation of workplace adaptability and satisfaction, and customer service on-boarding.

Enrollment Development during my tenure has seen a 3.1% enrollment gain in incoming class this past fall with corresponding increase in a point of Yield effectiveness and approximately 1.75% decrease in melt during this time. The current enrollment cycle introduced participation in the Common Application which greatly enhanced the WKU profile in participation. Though this does tend to decrease yield participation, nonetheless the institution is seeing a 25% increase in Applications, 27% increase in admitted students, and 5% increase in confirmations of enrollment year-to-date. The institution is poised to begin liking and reverse enrollment decline from the past decade.

Student success, measured in retention and persistence of students, has seen continuous improvement. Fall to spring participation is at 85.4%, the highest in a decade of tracking this metric (returning first-year students are continuing at the rate of 91.6%). 83.8% of overall underrepresented minority students returned at the highest rate since 2010. First-Time, low-income students returned at 90%. First-Time, full-Time students identifying as first-generation students returned at 88.5%.

Redesign and build out a modern enrollment management arm of the Division with added support and progressive advances for the recruitment and cultivation of undergraduate students to the University. Enrollment strategy is data informed, invoking predictive modeling towards student interest and matriculation as a matter of marketing, engagement, and enrollment.

Scholarship leveraging and designed of financial support programs that work in concert with admissions to build upon a highly engaged value proposition to students with significant support for financial exigency amongst potential students.

In partnership with the Strategic Operations & Finance Division, support the development of University budgets through the fluidity of net tuition revenue projections. Beginning at the student level, balancing the variable financial supports to the student to leverage optimal financial propositions to prospective and continuing students while supporting levels of University investment.

Merging the Student Experience element of the division which represents the traditional Student Affairs roles of an institution with our focus on the engaged student. The central strategy of the Student Experience components within the University are the involvement of all students in an aspect of the institution's culture academically and extracurricular.

In partnership with the Academic Affairs Division, advancing academic advising to not only serve as a contact point to evaluate engagement, but also to identify possible at-risk profiles for early intervention. Maintaining a centralized advising service to all students for lower division course work across the institution.

Expanding Student Housing, in partnership with Academic Affairs, to incorporate a reimagined and energized Living, Learning Community (LLC) program in its second year. Students in the LLC cohorts are persisting at 95.7%. This program demonstratively demonstrates lift in persistence and retention amongst students involved with these programs. Representing the University during the construction of new residence halls.

Liaising and engaging with external contracted services (University dinning is facilitated through an Aramark contract; student housing properties are privately held with Student Life Foundation Board, not for-profit). Serving as the University Point of Contact and ad hoc member of the Student Life Foundation Board, respectively.

Supporting the Intercultural Student Engagement Center which serves as a central hub for all underrepresented students. These programs and support activities have achieved an illustrative effect on student persistence, with underrepresented students approaching comparable retention rates as the majority population.

Through Career Services engagement, building corporate partnerships not only for prospective employees of our college graduates, but also for increasing corporate education opportunities for individuals, or groups of employees in their professional development, certificate and degree completions, and/or research engagements and development. Hosting featured corporate events to foster internship opportunities and spotlight on employment for particular industry.
